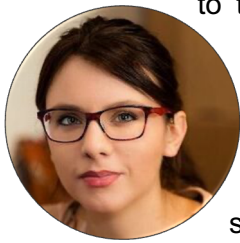

Within a year of establishment we have successfully organized various capacity building activities that includes youth IGF Nepal Annual Event 2022, youth IGF Asia Pacific, Digital Freedom Summit 2022, High-Level panel on Internet Regulation in Nepal, Online Child Safety Workshop for School Teachers and Parents.

This year youth IGF Nepal brought together more than 90 young representatives from various stakeholder groups to join the one-day capacity building program. It addressed topics such as strengthening youth engagement in internet governance, ensuring internet safety, formulating youth-centric policies, and promoting secure internet usage through workshops and discussions.

## Opening Plenary:



The event commenced with the Opening Plenary, featuring notable guests such as Pursotam Khanal, Chairman of the Nepal Telecommunication Authority as the Chief Guest, and Michael Croft, UNESCO Representative to Nepal as the Keynote Speaker. They delivered impactful speeches highlighting the importance of a secure Internet for youth. Anja Genjo, NRI Coordinator from the UN IGF Secretariat, attended as a special guest and commended the Youth IGF Nepal team for their remarkable work. Additional guests, including Babu Ram Aryal, Chair of the Digital Freedom Coalition, and Birendra Kumar Mishra, Chair of the Nepal IGF, Ashirwad Tripathy, ViceChair of APriGF contributed valuable insights to the discussions.

## Youth Perspectives Unleashed: Navigating the Presence of Youths in Internet Governance Spaces and Their Role for a Better Digital Future

A panel discussion titled "Youth Perspectives Unleashed: Navigating the Presence of Youths in Internet Governance Spaces and Their Role for a Better Digital Future" featured youth speakers from Nepal, India, South Korea, Myanmar, and Nigeria. They shared their perspectives and experiences in Internet governance, fostering an exchange of ideas and exploring the role of youth in shaping the digital landscape. The panel discussion was moderated by Bibek Silwal.



An awareness presentation on **"How Not to be a Victim Online?"** was delivered by Suyash Nepal, enlightening participants about online safety and cybersecurity. The presentation aimed to equip attendees with knowledge and strategies to navigate the digital world securely.



### **Youth at the Digital Crossroads: Shaping Policies for an Inclusive Internet**

The 45-minute session commenced with a brief introduction of the panelists, each possessing rich expertise and experience in their respective domains. This panel was comprised of renowned speakers in their respective fields, Mr. Ismaran Duwadi, CEO/Co-Founder of Code Himalaya, Mr. Sandesh Shrestha, Joint Attorney at the Office of Attorney General, Ms. Priyanka Jha, Vice-Chair of Media Action Nepal and Mr. Ajaya Siwakoti, Central Committee Member of Nepali Congress and this session was moderated by Adv. Mamta Siwakoti.

The moderator skillfully steered the conversation, covering diverse aspects such as the digital divide, misinformation and disinformation, weaknesses in existing policies, the impact of technological advancements, and the role of political parties in shaping the digital landscape.

Mr. Ismaran Duwadi, drawing from his entrepreneurial journey, highlighted the immense potential of the IT sector in Nepal and the need for government support and subsidies to foster growth. He emphasized the challenges faced by emerging IT companies, including taxation issues and the requirement to use Nepali servers, hindering their competitiveness in the Indian market.

Additionally, he emphasized the importance of updating the IT curriculum in educational institutions to align with industry demands.



Mr. Sandesh Shrestha, with his legal expertise, shed light on the existing cybersecurity laws in Nepal, pointing out the need for comprehensive regulations that address the complexities of the digital landscape. He stressed the importance of strengthening investigation infrastructure, establishing dedicated cyber bureaus, and expanding the jurisdiction of courts to ensure accessible justice for cybercrime cases across Nepal.

Ms. Priyanka Jha, representing the civil society, highlighted the pressing issue of the digital divide in Nepal, encompassing gender, economic, and geographical disparities. She emphasized the need for public-private partnerships to bridge this divide and advocated for policies that address the socio-economic factors contributing to the digital divide. She also emphasized the importance of balancing freedom of expression with combating misinformation and disinformation, stressing the need for digital literacy and education to foster a thriving democracy.

Mr. Ajaya Siwakoti, speaking on behalf of the Nepali Congress, discussed how issues such as digital divide, digital literacy, and AI are actively deliberated in the party's policymaking meetings.



He expressed concerns about the potential impact of AI on employment and emphasized the party's commitment to enacting policies that strike a balance between protecting individuals from misinformation and upholding freedom of expression.

### Youth in the Digital Frontier: Unlocking Opportunities in Global Internet Governance



The session titled "Youth in the Digital Frontier: Unlocking Opportunities in Global Internet Governance" was expertly moderated by Ashirwad Tripathy. The panel featured esteemed speakers including Prof Salma Abbasi, the visionary Founder and CEO of eWorldwide Group; Amrita Choudhary, a prominent tech policy expert and Chair APRALO; Roshan Pokharel, an esteemed academic and Internet Governance researcher; Veronica Piccolo, the inspiring Chair of ISOC Youth SG; and Sarah Lake, the dedicated Community Engagement Manager at the Internet Society. The session addressed the importance of youth participation in shaping the global Internet governance landscape. Prof Salma Abbasi emphasized the need for building human digital resilience and highlighted key factors to consider. Amrita Choudhary discussed the opportunities available for youth in internet organizations such as ICANN, IGF, and APNIC, including fellowship and capacity-building programs. Sarah Lake introduced the Internet Society's Vision and Mission and encouraged youth to join as members. Veronica Piccolo shared her experience as a youth in the global Internet governance ecosystem, highlighting the activities of the ISOC Youth SG. Roshan Pokharel provided insights on how newcomers can participate and contribute to effecting change. The session concluded with Q&A and closing remarks from the speakers, emphasizing the importance of unity through understanding, respect, and engagement.





## Human Rights in the Digital Age: Multi-Stakeholder Roleplay Session

The thought-provoking session titled "Human Rights in the Digital Age: Multi-Stakeholder Roleplay Session" was facilitated by Surendra Tiwari, Sadikshya Silwal, Sanjina Kshitri, and Kabita Rai. Through a roleplay exercise, participants were actively engaged in exploring the importance of safeguarding human rights in the digital realm and the significance of a multistakeholder approach in addressing human rights challenges online.



The 'Human Rights in Digital Age: Multi-Stakeholder Role-play Session' provided participants with an immersive experience exploring the complexities of digital rights in today's world. Through presentations, role-playing, and group discussions, the session examined the significance of digital rights and their relevance to youth. The selected topic of 'Social Media Platform Registration in Nepal' sparked lively discussions among participants representing different stakeholders. The session emphasized the importance of multi-stakeholder collaboration in addressing digital rights issues effectively. Overall, the session fostered an engaging environment that enlightened participants on digital rights while showcasing the power of collective action in safeguarding these fundamental rights.

### Closing Ceremony

The Closing Ceremony, which marked the end of the event, included the leadership handover from the current Chair, Deepa Bhattarai, representing Youth IGF Nepal, to the incoming Chair, Ananda Gautam. The ceremony was graced by the presence of Er. Dipesh Bista, CEO of the eGovernance Commission, as the closing guest. Additionally, the newly appointed Vice President, Surendra Tiwari, was also acknowledged for his role and contributions to the organization. The ceremony provided a platform to recognize and appreciate the efforts of the outgoing and incoming leadership, reinforcing the importance of youth engagement in shaping the future of Internet governance. The outgoing Chair, Deepa Bhattarai expressed gratitude to all the contributors and supporting organizations for their unwavering commitment to the program and extended best wishes for a successful term to the new leadership.
